## *Mansion in May*

### TUDOR GLAM

A black and white Turkish marble floor and custom walnut cabinetry with burlled center panels and handcarved legs set the classic tone for a bathroom designed by Anthony Passanante of Anthony Albert Studios. Such details plus the Gothic shape of the vanity mirror and linen closet doors show how the home's architecture inspired Passanante, an allied member of the American Society of Interior Designers and a certified kitchen and bath designer. But he also wanted to make the space fresh and glamorous, so he painted the ceiling in a dark sheen to reflect light and installed antiqued mirrors above the vanity, on the vanity corners and on linen cabinet doors with a leaded grid that mimics the window. Crystals create sparkle in the chandelier, sconces and door hardware, while sumptuous fabric adds a splash of color on an ottoman and drapery that visually separates the linen cabinet from the rest of the room. To hide an unsightly radiator under the window, Passanante designed a furniture-like wood cover with cutouts for airflow and a top made of the same Carrera marble as on the vanity.
